Borough of Stockton Ordinance No. 2025-01

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF STOCKTON, HUNTERDON COUNTY, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, ENTITLED "TAXATION", TO ADD AN ARTICLE DISABLED VETERAN PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTION

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30, the dwelling house and the portion of the lot that is reasonably necessary for enjoyment whereupon the same is erected, of any citizen and resident of this State, honorably discharged or released under honorable circumstances, from active service, in time of war, in any branch of the Armed Forces of the United States, who has been or shall be declared by the United States Veterans Administration or its successor to have a service-connected disability declared by the Unites States Veterans Administration or its successor to be a total or 100 percent permanent and total disability, and not so evaluated solely because of hospitalization or surgery and recuperation, sustained through enemy action, or accident, or resulting from disease contracted while in such active service, shall be exempt from taxation on proper claim made therefor; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 54:4-3.31, upon review and approval of the required documentation by the municipal tax assessor, the assessor shall allow said exemption from taxation for the tax year in which the claim was filed; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to <u>N.J.S.A.</u> 54:4-3.32, the governing body of each municipality, by appropriate resolution, may return all taxes collected on property from prior years which would have been exempt had proper claim been timely made in writing; and

WHEREAS, the statutory intent to grant discretion to the governing body of every municipality has been affirmed by court decisions that have held that a municipality had discretion to grant or deny a taxpayer a retroactive refund of property taxes that has been paid for the effective date of the disability as determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs as set forth in N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council desires to establish a formal policy providing that a retroactive refund of property taxes as set forth in <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 54:4-3.32 shall be limited to the current year of the submission of a proper claim to the tax assessor as required by <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 54:4-3.30.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the Governing Body of the Borough of Stockton in Hunterdon County, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. Article Disabled Veteran Property Tax Exemption

A refund of property taxes pursuant to N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.32 shall be granted provided that the applicant submits a complete application to the tax assessor as required by N.J.S.A. 54:4-3.30. A retroactive refund shall be limited to the current year of the submission of the application to the tax assessor.

- Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage, approval, and publication as required by law.
- Section 3. Ordinances, resolutions, regulations or parts of ordinances, resolutions, and regulations inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.
- Section 4. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, or phrase of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such a decision shall not affect the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

RESOLUTION 2025-34

STOCKTON BOROUGH TO PRESERVE NEW JERSEY HISTORIC PRESERVATION FUND ADMINISTERED BY THE NEW JERSEY HISTORIC TRUST

WHEREAS, The governing body of Stockton Borough desires to further historic preservation through a grant from the New Jersey Historic Trust, State of New Jersey in the amount of \$43,875 for the following project: District No. 98 Schoolhouse.

THEREFORE, the governing body authorizes Council President Mike Mann and Mayor Aaron Lipsen to execute a grant agreement with the State in an amount up to that awarded for the proposed project, and to seal the grant agreement.

RESOLUTION 2025-35 AUTHORIZING FINAL PAYMENT TO BE MADE TO DIAMOND CONSTRUCTION FOR THE HILLTOP DRIVE & MOORE STREET IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT AND APPROVING FINAL CHANGE ORDERS 1A AND 1B

WHEREAS, by Resolution 2020-57 adopted on August 17, 2020, Stockton Borough awarded a contract to Diamond Construction for completion of the Hilltop Drive & Moore Avenue Improvements project ("Project") for a total not to exceed amount of \$440,197.25; and

WHEREAS, construction was completed in January 2023 and to date, the Borough has paid Diamond Construction a total of \$421,239.99 through three separate payment requests; and

WHEREAS, Diamond Construction has submitted a request to the Borough for final payment in the amount of \$8,596.73, which includes retainage amounts from Payments 1, 2 and 3 previously made; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer has confirmed that the final as-built contract price is \$429,836.72 (including the final payment of \$8,596.73), which is a reduction in the original not-to-exceed contract amount of \$10,360.53; and

WHEREAS, it appears that Diamond Construction did not submit the required maintenance bond in 2023 and the two-year maintenance period for the project as described in the Form of Maintenance Bond has elapsed; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Engineer's review of available aerial imagery and a field inspection by the Engineer's office indicates that the proposed improvements were satisfactorily constructed and remain in good condition, and therefore, recommends that this maintenance requirement be waived and no further action be required pursuant to bonding or maintenance of the improvements; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Stockton on this 17th day of March, 2025 as follows:

- 1. The recitals in the "Whereas" clauses are incorporated herein as if fully restated.
- 2. Final payment in the amount of \$8,596.73 is hereby approved to be made to Diamond Construction, which is inclusive of the retainage on this Project.
- 3. The final contract amount is reduced from \$440,197.25 to \$429,836.72.

- 4. The maintenance bond requirement is hereby waived based on the reasons provided by the Borough Engineer.
- 5. Change Order Nos. 1A and 1B are hereby approved.
